
David Wilkinson – DR107

Aussie trip complete, 50 hr complete on the RV8 so time to get back into the DR107. The basic wing structure is now complete, sanded and shaped.


I'm now onto building the ailerons so that I can fit them along with the bell cranks, all hinges and pitot tube before gluing the 1/8 thick ply skins on (will wait until the weather warms up)

Corrin McCrae from Aerowood in Pukekohe has CNC machined all the aileron ribs for me... Yes cheating again.









The fuselage should be back in the next few months so I can then mate it to the wing and start the mammoth job of fitting all the bits to the fuse.

I have spent most of the past three months preparing and priming the wing components in readiness for assembly. One of the wing skins was very slightly damaged all along the leading edge by what appeared to be grit embedded in the blue vinyl. This was apparent only after I removed the vinyl. Van's immediately sent a free replacement skin by courier, no quibbling and no fuss. It was delivered to my door ten days later. I had been expecting rather a delay, so that's why I started the flaperons first. I have just about completed them both, and I hope to carry on with the wings again in the next week. Working with 0.016" Alclad has been a challenge – of course the second flaperon turned out better than the first after my learning curve flattened off.






