I think it is fair to say that this past year ADS-B was (finally) put to bed, the CAA subsidy scheme is working and the date for compulsory use in controlled airspace extended to 31 Dec 2022. There are one or two anomalies still be sorted but they relate to individual manufacturers and will be worked through. We now have our DL9 PPL which gives 98% of us the ability to do what we want to do without a Class 2 medical.

Both the above are major achievements which would not have been achieved without our association with the Aviation Federation and the work of our representative Evan Wheeler, for which I give thanks.

Hi everyone.

I usually say that another month has flown by but this month it is another year. With the Chapter AGM being

held this month, we close out what has been an eventful twelve months.

It being our AGM, I would ask that as many members as possible come to the meeting so we have the numbers necessary for a quorum. We will be making the AGM portion of the meeting as quick as possible so we can get on to hearing from our guest speakers.

The Minutes of the previous AGM have already been distributed. As you will recall, last years AGM was held by email ballot as we were in the middle of a nationwide lockdown, so our thanks must go to Keith Weale for sorting out a way to do this so we could meet our requirements as an Incorporated Society.

If you have any matters arising from the minutes, please have these ready for discussion so we can get through them without delay.

You will have also already received a copy of the Chapter Accounts for the 2020/2021 Financial Period so we would very much appreciate it if you could review these prior to the meeting so we can reduce the amount of time needed to get through the AGM.

On the projects front, my thanks go out to those who provided updates for the newsletter. Pickings were a little slim when I sent out the extra request on Monday, but I have had a good response since.

DCM was somewhat disappointed that he was not able to complete the maiden flight of his RV-12 in time for the newsletter. He has now completed the CAA inspection on his aircraft but the weather last weekend did not cooperate to allow the flight.

In speaking with Pete Walton, he is definitely at the 98% complete, 95% to go stage. To be fair Pete's RV-14 is very much on the home straight with just the final few avionics issues to sort out, the 100 hour inspection to complete and the CAA inspection to be undertaken. All things being equal, Pete's RV-14 should also have its maiden flight in the

next month. Then again, I have thought that before and been wrong. Fingers and toes crossed for Pete.

On the SAANZ front, I have a couple of matters I need to pass on from the last Council meeting.

The first is with regards to the new DL9 medical for the DL9 PPL. Members are reminded they need to send a copy of their DL9 medical to CAA and to keep a copy with them at all times while flying. As with the Class 1 and 2 medicals, we are required to keep our latest medicals with us and the same holds true with the DL9 medical.

Also, the Council is asking members to report any instances of being denied entry to airspace by Airways NZ. The Council has been asked to collate any such instances and forward these to CAA so they can hold Airways to task. If you have any instances, please forward details to the SAANZ Administrator at admin@saa.org.nz.

On the home front, my Sopwith Camel build is progressing. I have now rigged the main flying wires and will be moving on to the landing wires this coming weekend. As much as you would think this would be a relatively straight forward exercise, it is not. Installing, crimping, and rigging each cable is a fussy and slow process as the rigging obviously needs to be correct otherwise the aircraft will not be straight. I am looking forward to getting this complete and moving on to fitting the ribs to the wings.

Not much else to report so I will finish up and get this sent out. I hope you enjoy the newsletter.

Don't use ABC Fire Extinguishers

The only fire extinguishers that should be used around our airplanes are Halon and perhaps CO2. The ABC fire extinguishers typically found in the stores are highly corrosive.

We had an airplane come to the shop for its first CI. It had been built by one of the "pro shops", whose name I will leave off. We discovered that the 4 spar bolts were missing as per the Van's SB, which there is no excuse for, as the airplane was less than a year old. In the process of opening up the flooring to insert the bolts, we noticed a horrible amount of corrosion on everything, including spar bolts, trim motor, trim springs, and all metal screws throughout the interior, and even the rear spar bolts. The pictures would make you cringe.



There was also a very fine powder throughout the interior of the aircraft, which I thought could have been fiberglass sanding residue. The corrosion looked like someone had spilled a bucket of acid inside the airplane, so we encouraged the owner to reach out to the builder.



He was informed that there had been a fire on the first engine start due to a disconnected fuel line and a fire extinguisher was used to put the fire out. Obviously, the wrong type of extinguisher!

I spoke to an arson investigator today who has a metallurgist on staff. He says the airplane should not be flown without being completely disassembled and thoroughly cleaned, as the dust from the fire extinguisher is now everywhere and it is extremely corrosive.

I can only imagine that some of the dust has also penetrated into the avionics and can only guess as to its impact down the road. The dust is as fine as flour.


